And the dish ran away with the spoon



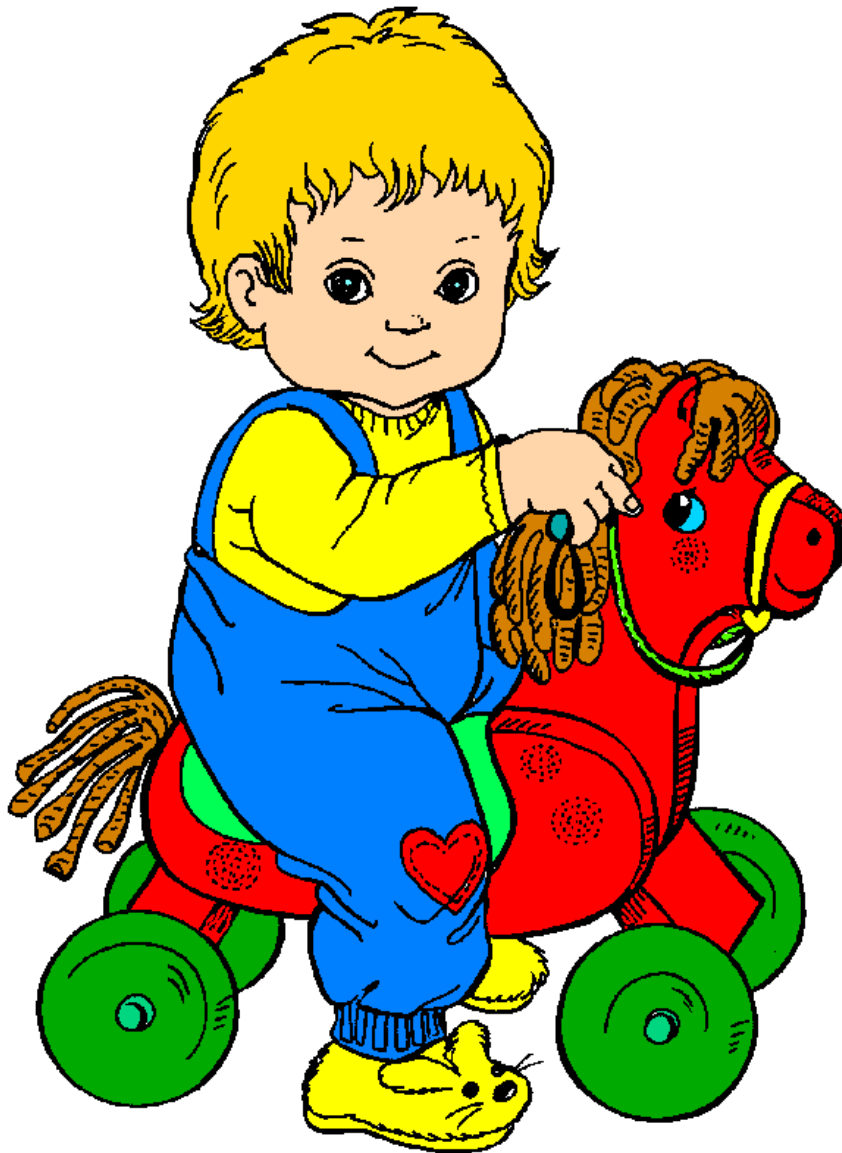
Hickory Dickory Dock

With a One...two...three!



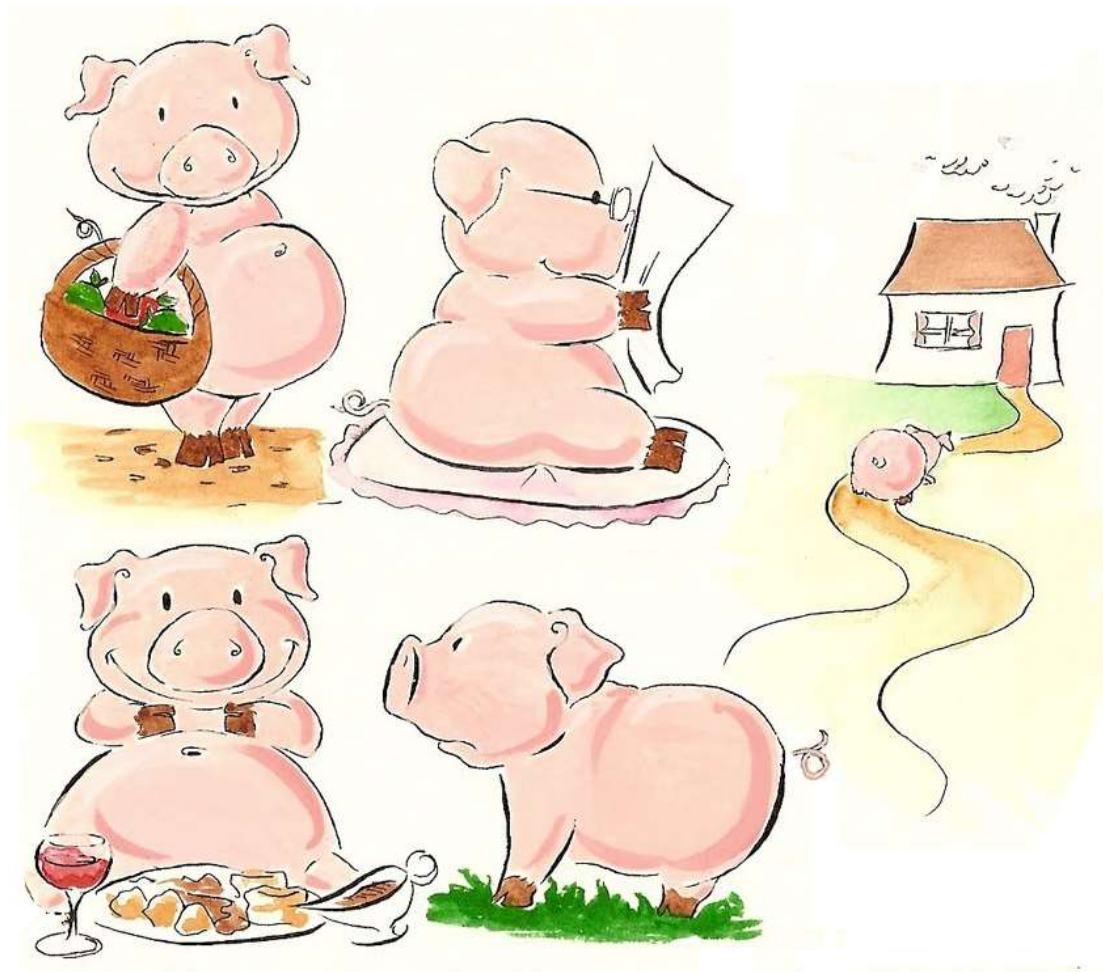
See Saw Margery Daw

Because he can't work any faster



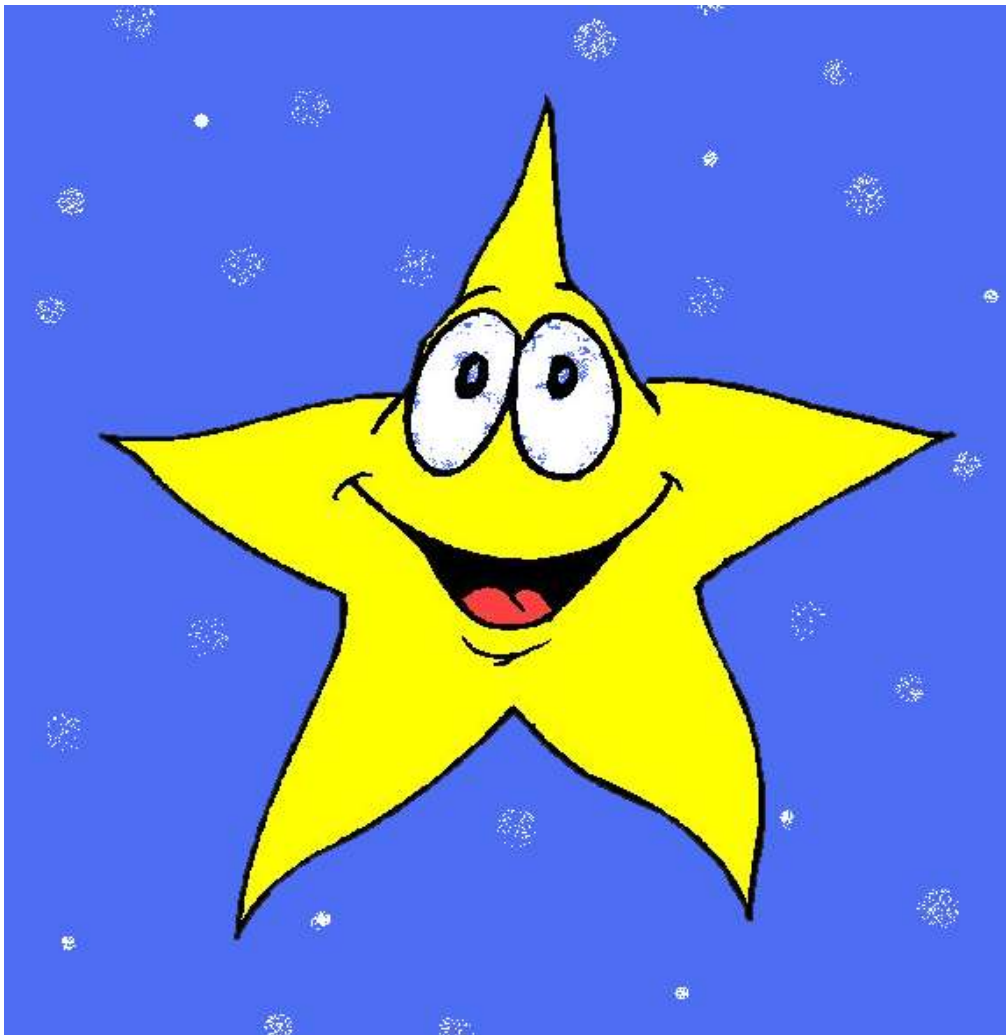
This Little Piggy

Wee wee wee, all the way home



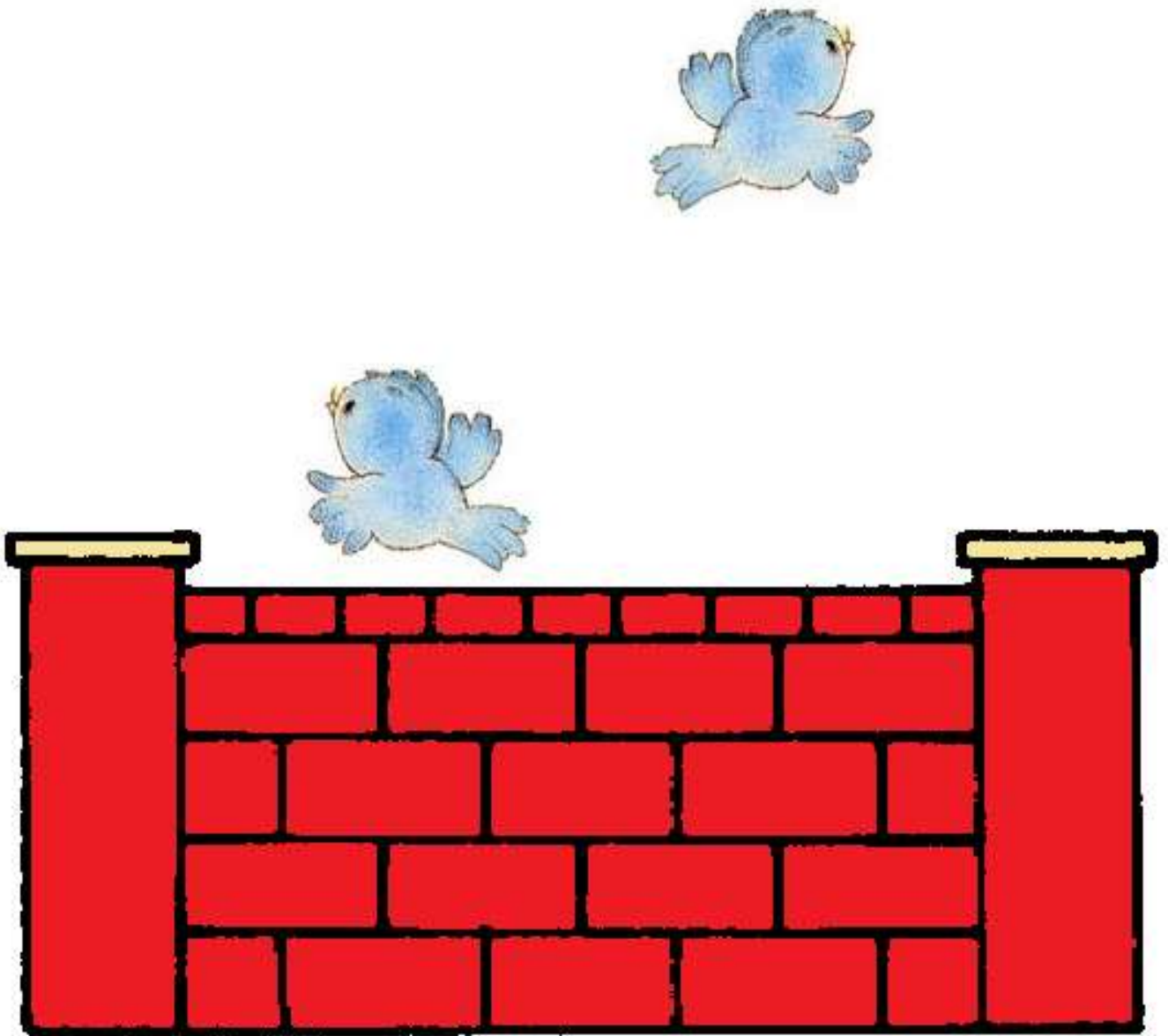
Twinkle Twinkle Little Star
